Maternal HEALTHCARE

The Heartline Maternity Center combats the dismal maternal health reality in Haiti through excellent medical care, health education, nutrition, and compassionate support. The Heartline model effectively reduces the high incidence of maternal and infant mortality and prevents children from becoming orphans.

The Heartline Maternity Center provides expectant mothers in Haiti with a full prenatal program, labor and delivery services with certified midwives and nurses, and a six month postpartum program of weekly medical care, child development education, and breastfeeding support.

Empowering Haitians with education and income-generating skills to catalyze economic development and break the cycle of poverty.


Celebrating 8 years in operation, the Heartline Bakery offers economic opportunity and produces bread for ministry, retail and wholesale.

Forced to choose between meeting basic survival necessities and sending their children to school, many families cannot afford the cost of education.






